Thank you for the consultation in respect of the application requesting permission to increase output at the above site.

In respect of this specific consideration, archaeology will not be a material issue of concern.

On-going Archaeological Interest

However, there is an archaeological interest with the site, in connection with construction work, that is to be investigated in line with a Written Scheme of Investigation ('WSI') for the geoarchaeological assessment and analysis and archaeological watching brief to be prepared (currently in draft form, Orion Heritage) in accordance with Requirement 7 of the Riverside Energy Park Order (2020) as amended which came into force on 10 March 2021.

Schedule 2 of the Order presents 33 Requirements, conditions that must be met at various stages prior to the Authorised Development becoming operational. Requirement 7: Archaeology, that no part of the Work Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 9 as set out in Schedule 1 of the Order can commence until a written scheme of investigation for that work has been submitted to and approved by the relevant planning authority.

We act for Cory Environmental Holdings Limited and Riverside Resource Recovery Limited (“**Cory**”) and write in respect of Cory's application to vary the current section 36 consent for the Riverside Resource Recovery Facility (“**RRRF**”) pursuant to section 36C of the Electricity Act 1989 (“**the Application**”).
